THE WILLIAM J. JACKSON FAMILY

There are so many stories about the pioneer families coming into the newly opened Oklahoma territory, but the story of the coming of my mother's family is the long struggle of deciding to come down where they had no relatives.

My grandfather, W. J. Jackson, had brought his family to Coldwater, Kansas, from Indiana only to find people were moving down to the new assigned land.

My grandmother desperately wanted to go back to her beloved home in Indiana. But since it was not a good idea at that time, she tried to persuade my grandfather to move on down, but he did have relatives there in Kansas.

The days before the Run were exciting for the children. My mother was nine and her two brothers four and six years younger.

People came by in decorated buggies, loaded wagons covered with quips like "Oklahoma or bust", "Oklahoma, here we come," and others.

Coldwater was emptying fast, and there just wasn't any work for a struggling young lawyer.

But they didn't leave for the new promised land until 1896, and they came on the still new train that came down from Kansas through Guthrie.

Previously, a young nephew staked or bought, a claim near Guthrie and then got a job with the railway people. He had brought my mother down for a short visit in Guthrie, where his young sister would show her a good time. During the visit, the nephew brought her down to Norman for a July Fourth picnic.

The young nephew introduced her to Governor Hogg who had come from Texas to deliver the main speech at the picnic.

It was the young nephew also, who finally convinced my grandfather that the little new town of Norman could very well use another lawyer. All he would have to do to believe it would be to stand and watch the crowds at the doors of the few lawyers who had begun practice in Norman. There were many cases involving disputes over claims, and legal processing of claim sales.

Anyway, one day in the middle of March, 1896, W. J. Jackson with wife, Mary Ellen, daughter Frona (my mother) and two sons, Orie and Ed, stepped off the train at Norman, into a blinding dust storm.

They had never seen anything like it, and there were no relatives waiting to greet them.

And again, my grandmother longed for her Indiana home. However, through the years, she became an Oklahoman, and never went back but for a few days, years later, after the relatives were gone.

The Jacksons in Oklahoma began with six people, the young nephew in Guthrie and the five members of the W. J. Jacksons in Norman, Oklahoma Territory. They have now multiplied and scattered over the United States. Here is a list of the descendants of W. J. Jackson.
